We hope that you are finding the system manageable and a more effective system for payments to school.

Christmas Service at St. John's on Thursday 19th December at 9.30am:

Please come along to our special Christmas Service at St. John's on Thursday if you can. It is always a very special event at the end of this term and is usually very well attended by parents and wider family members. The children have been voting for their charity of choice for our collection in church and have selected The World Wildlife Fund! If you are coming along we would appreciate a small donation to this important cause at the end of our service.

Attendance and Punctuality:

During a review with the Attendance team from Westmorland and Furness Council, it was made clear that the council are taking steps to sanction parents and carers when children are taken out of school for term time holidays without authorisation.

Please can I remind everyone to ensure you refer to our website where term dates for the remainder of this year and next academic year are now published. It is really important that your child regularly attends school and does not accumulate unauthorised sessions that could result in fines and prosecution.

Punctuality was also reviewed and has been identified as an area for improvement as we have a small number of children who are persistently late in the mornings. Our morning 'settling-in' routines work well to support our children to feel safe, calm and ready to learn each morning. Missing this vital time can cause children to feel unsettled for the remainder of the day. Over seven hours of learning time has been lost this term to lateness.

On a more positive note, at the end of this week, over 40 children will be receiving a special certificate and prize for attending school every day this term.

After school Clubs:

In the new year, some of our clubs will be restarting for the spring term. Chess Club, Running Club, Young Voices, Gym club and Art Club all restart in January; look out for notification.

Spring Calendar:

The spring calendar will be populated with events very soon, so please check back regularly so that you are able to keep in touch with what's coming up in our school dairy.

Please note that school ends this Friday at 2pm for all learners and that all pupils need to be collected from school promptly.
